

There are still a few spots available in the "Vintage Windmill" class. You can sign up by contacting Gail Larderuccio (see the directory for contact information).






**Sunday, September 8, 2024** – Workshop Harvest Pumpkin Collage—Sandra Mollon

## August 2025 Quilt show and Opportunity Quilt News

#### **Opportunity Quilt**

Our lovely opportunity quilt is at the quilter, and we are targeting our September 28 auction for the big reveal. Additionally, the tickets have been ordered and received (thanks Michelle Howe) so we will have tickets to sell at the auction as well. Distribution to our members will begin with the November 2024 guild meeting. In the meantime, we need help with the quilt and tickets.



#### Quilt Show—Need Help!

We need someone to step up and take responsibility for finding places to show the quilt and sell tickets. This person will be responsible for moving the quilt around until the show on October 11, 2025. Two people or even three could take on this job to make it easier. Those who are taking the quilt around will get to visit other guilds, see new speakers, and show our lovely quilt to the masses. It is really a fun job! We will furnish a quilt stand to hang the quilt on, plenty of tickets to sell, and change to be used as needed. This is usually a cash or check only operation.

Secondly, we need someone to step up and be the quilt ticket manager. This person will be furnished a prepared packet of tickets for each guild member and a checklist to keep track of who took their tickets, which tickets they took, and plenty of additional tickets for any visitors to our meetings. They will also take the proceeds of any sales at other guilds (when we show the quilt) from the person who took the quilt out and pass the proceeds along to the treasurer for deposit. This person will work with the quilt manager to set up and staff the quilt display at the quilt show on Oct 11, 2025.

For general show activity, let's focus on this year's September 28 auction, and give Kathy Keefer the help she will need, and then we can turn our attention to our quilt show. 
