Krista Moser of The Quilted Life Presents Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend

Krista is the creative force and inspiration behind The Quilted Life. She is the designer of the 60 Degree Diamond Rulers for Creative Grids, and has published dozens of patterns using the rulers, with more in development all the time. Krista loves symmetry, clean lines, and bold colors. She thinks that shapes that tessellate in all directions are a playground for design.



A quilting and fiber arts enthusiast, Krista began

sewing at 8 years old. Through her presentation, Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend, Krista will share the story of how she began her professional sewing and quilting career at the spunky age of fourteen. <u>All of Krista's patterns, kits, rulers, and tutorials may be found at her website kristamoser.com</u>.

September 9, 2024 – Program

Sandra Mollon, Textile Artist, Instructor, Author, Designer Adapting an Image for an Art Quilt

Sandra is a California based textile artist. With a long love of textiles, she spent many years working in traditional hand applique. Her recent work includes art quilts which are photo based.

Stemming from a lifelong interest in photography, and as she saw amazing art quilts derived from photographs, moving into raw-edge collage art quilts became for her a way to combine those interests and create work that has a photorealistic quality. That work has brought a new audience into the textile art world. This lecture describes the process of adapting your photos in preparation of creating a collage with examples. Sandra will bring quilts to show and offer us a unique perspective on how we can grow as quilters.

On June 9th and 10th, we were honored to have Barbara Blanton who so graciously put on two workshops to teach us "needle-turn" Applique. We had a lot of fun and learned a new and valuable skill.





In August, we welcome **Krista Moser** who will be teaching two different workshops— "Fall Foliage" and "Vintage Windmill." Both patterns require the Creative Grids 60-degree Diamond Mini Ruler which Krista designed and uses in her patterns.

Both patterns incorporate hexagon blocks which are designed so as not to have any "Y" seams.

The "<u>Fall Foliage</u>" workshop will be held on Sunday, August 11, 2024, at Orange Quilt

Bee, 628 E. Katella Ave., Orange, CA 92867 from 10am to 4pm. Kits are available in Purple Gelato or Moss Green ombre backgrounds.

The <u>"Vintage Windmill" workshop</u> will be held on Monday, August 12, 2024, at University United Methodist Church, 18422 Culver Dr., Irvine CA 92612 from 10am to 4pm. Kits are available in Victory Garden, Brave (Patriotic), or Christmas prints.

Both workshops cost \$40, each. Requirements are the Creative Grids Mini 60-degree diamond ruler and the desired pattern. The ruler, pattern and kits are available from Krista's website.

Joanne English – Berries

Bought the Berries kit from Joanna Figueroa when she came to our February General meeting. This project marked her first time making the prairie point border and was delighted with the results. For quilting, she opted for a diamond design.

Cindy Hinds – Biggy the Bee

This is a baby quilt pattern and kit by our upcoming August speaker, Krista Moser.





Cindy Hinds - Log Cabin

Began as a retreat quilt project with Laundry Basket Quilts, she added the additional zigzag border to the quilt.

Trudy Cleveland – <u>Unknown</u> <u>Soldier</u>

This was her Cherrywood Challenge project. Poppy was the theme. This quilt was a finalist in the competition and will be traveling to a quilt show.





Judy Dimmick – Souvenir Socks

This was the Orange County Quilters Guild Fabric Grab Bag Challenge. She challenged herself to make paper-pieced blocks. The socks represent the seasons. The blocks were started out as a large pattern then she reduced it to fit the diameter limits.



Judy Dimmick – Kaffe Stars

This quilt was a Block Exchange rounder with the Beach Cities Quilt Guild. These are the blocks that she liked best, and they were from her blue fabrics and backing from her "collection."

Bretta Gunther – Superstition

This was Crabapple Hill Studios pattern and there are twenty-six alphabet blocks using piecing, embroidery, and colored pencils.





Bretta Genther and Mary Branco

These were an <u>embroidery pillow</u> <u>project</u> that was done at a workshop with Kaari Meng of French General.



Eileen Thiessen – Guacamole

This was her first square quilt. It started out smaller and grew with her enthusiasm. The fabric was Lucy June by Riley Blake. It was quilted with Guacamole by Karen Aleta Miller of Cosmic Quilts.
