



Green ombre background.

The "Vintage Windmill" workshop will be held on Monday, August 12, 2024, at University United Methodist Church, 18422 Culver Dr., Irvine, CA 92612 from 10AM to 4PM. Kits are available in Victory Garden, Brave (Patriotic), or Christmas prints.

Both workshops cost \$40. Requirements are the Creative Grids Mini 60-degree diamond ruler and the desired pattern.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR LONGARM QUILTING SERVICE

A CHECKLIST BY LAUREL HATHAWAY

Thank you for the opportunity to be featured in your guild newsletter. My name is Laurel Hathaway and I own Hathaway Quiltworks in Laguna Hills. I specialize in edge-to-edge computerized longarm quilting. It is my pleasure to offer this checklist to ensure the best results for your finished quilt.

ш	separately as they will be loaded into the longarm in that order. No need to pin or baste!
	Examine your quilt top and repair any loose seams, especially those along the outside edges.
	It is essential that your seams are pressed flat, either open or to one side. Take care to follow your pattern pressing instructions for the best results. Using a clapper, steam and/or starch are some ways to help you achieve flat seams especially in bulky areas. Also, perfecting your 1/4" seaming and avoiding any twisted seams will help your blocks lay flat and square.
	Take a few minutes to trim any loose threads on the back of the quilt top, especially those near white fabric. It may seem tedious, but you won't be sorry.
	If your quilt is directional, or you wish a certain side to be on the top, please mark the top with a safety pin and a note.
	Measure the width and length of your quilt top to the nearest 1/2". This will help you determine your batting and backing sizes.
Note:	If your quilt has raised lettering on tee shirts, flanges, appliqué, embroidery, or is embellished please ask for special instructions.
THE	BACKING
	Your backing fabric needs to be 8" wider and longer than your quilt top. This enables the quilter to roll the backing onto the bars and place clamps on the sides.
	Wide 108" backing is available and eliminates the need for piecing. It is best to purchase an 1/8-1/4 yard extra to ensure that it can be squared up properly. I have a large work table and will do that for you.
	Other yardage may need to be pieced. Please remove the selvedges and pin to reduce stretching. Use 5/8" or wider seams and press open. If the design on your fabric is large you may want to consider pattern matching the seams for a perfect finish. Hathaway Quiltworks offers back seaming and pattern matching services.
	Pieced blocks and multi-seamed backings are beautiful although sometimes difficult to center on a longarm. For best results, design backs that do not have an exact center or borders.
	Minky and Cuddle fabrics make cozy backings and I ask that you purchase your yardage so that the selvedges run down the sides of the quilt. This helps the fabric from stretching too much when loaded on the longarm and ensures that the nap is running along the length of the quilt for a beautiful, smooth finish.
	If your back is directional, please mark the top with a safety pin and a note.
THE	BATTING
	Hathaway Quiltworks offers Quilter's Dream 80/20 in Natural and White, Dream Wool, Dream Puff Poly and Dream Request Poly (lightweight for Minky/Cuddle backings). Or you may provide your own batting which should be at least 6" wider and longer than your quilt.






