

Sandra Mollon Textile Artist, Instructor, Author, Designer **Adapting an Image for an Art Quilt**

Sandra is a California based textile artist. With a long love of textiles, she spent many years working in traditional hand applique. Her recent work includes art quilts which are photo based.

Stemming from a lifelong interest in photography, and as she saw amazing art quilts derived from photographs, moving into raw-edge collage art quilts became, for her, a way to combine those interests and create work that has a photorealistic quality. That work has brought a new audience into the textile art world.



This lecture describes the process of adapting your photos in preparation for creating a collage with examples. Sandra will bring quilts to show and offer us a unique perspective on how we can grow as quilters.




November 11, 2024 – Program

Sujata Shah Graphic Designer and Textile Artist The Root Connection

My Journey as a Quilter

While growing up in India, rich colors, hand woven textiles and handcrafts were part of Sujata's daily life. She learned to appreciate the irregularities and imperfections of handmade crafts. Her instinctive ability to work with colors and textures combined with education in graphic design has helped her develop a unique style as a quilt designer.



Inspired by utilitarian quilts and handmade crafts from around the world, she developed an abstract form of traditional quilt blocks and subsequently published the book, <u>Cultural Fusion Quilts</u>.

Presentation includes a slide show of her travels in India as well as her journey as a quilter. The slide show is followed by a trunk show of original quilts. She will share how she connects the dots between the memories of the past, and today's creative process.



Coming Attractions — Workshop Updates

On August 11th and 12th, we had two wonderful workshops with **Krista Moser** who taught two different patterns — "Fall Foliage" and "Vintage Windmill." We had a great time learning new skills and two beautiful quilt designs. Thank you, Krista!

On Sunday, September 8th, 2024, we present Sandra Mollon who will be teaching

her <u>"Pumpkin Collage"</u> pattern. If you've ever wanted to try your hand at collage, this is a great opportunity! Participants will learn simple techniques for crafting fused art quilts, including a brief introduction to various artistic media such as color pencils and markers. Students will create their art quilts using Sandra's pattern as a foundation for their artistic journey.

This workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee, 628 E. Katella Ave., in Orange, CA from 10am to 4pm.



The price for the workshop is \$40 which includes Sandra's pattern. The kit is optional and costs \$35.

Please indicate if you'd like a kit. We will order it from the teacher for you.

This workshop is sold out, but you can sign up on the wait list.

On Sunday, November 10th, we welcome **Sujata Shaw** who will be teaching her "Improv Sunburst" quilt. Inspired by American Folk Art quilts, artist Sujata Shaw has put her own improvisational spin on the traditional Pinwheel quilt block to create her own unique block. Learn how to make this beautiful quilt without using any templates or applique.



This class is designed to focus on cutting multiple curves

through layers of fabric and then sewing the pieces back together. Sujata will share many tips on making your one-of-a-kind blocks and offer suggestions for color combinations and layouts. You will be amazed at how easy, fun and fast it is to make this tricky-looking block!

Sujata's teaching background includes workshops inspired by Gee's Bend quilts, needle -turn applique featuring her original designs, and color and design workshops. Sujata's design philosophy celebrates an ever-evolving process, finding excitement in the creative journey's unpredictability.

The class will take place at Orange Quilt Bee on Sunday, November 10th, 2024, from 10AM - 4PM. The cost of the workshop is \$40 plus \$12 for the pattern for a total of \$52.


